

**CMAA Fall Pilgrimage:
Gregorian Chant at the National Shrine
September 25 - 26, 2009**



This educational and liturgical event occurs in the Year of Jubilee of the Basilica of the National Shrine in Washington, DC , and is co-sponsored by St. John the Beloved Church in McLean, Virginia and the John Paul II Cultural Center.

The CMAA Fall Pilgrimage features: chant instruction by chant master Scott Turkington; a plenary lecture by Dr. William Mahrt, president of the CMAA; a final Mass in the Extraordinary Form; fully chanted ordinary and propers; organist David Lang; choral motets sung by the Choir of the National Shrine directed by Dr. Peter Latona. All participants receive a copy of the *Parish Book of Chant*, compiled and edited by Richard Rice, composer-in-residence at St. John the Beloved. The pilgrimage also includes conditions for gaining the Jubilee Year Plenary Indulgence.

Tuition is \$110 for all events and materials. Minimum age for registrants: 15. The conference begins at 1:00pm on Friday and ends with the 5:00pm Mass on Saturday in the crypt church at the National Shrine.

This pilgrimage is for beginning through advance chanters..It will train and inspire toward the goal of continuing the renaissance of sacred music in our time, both in the ordinary and extraordinary form of the Mass.
