**Scott Turkington** is an internationally acclaimed expert and presenter on Gregorian Chant and Polyphony. He has more than twenty years of experience in instructing singers of all abilities. He is on the Board of Directors of the Church Music Association of America, and an Advisory Board Member of the Saint Gregory Institute for Music and Liturgy. A native of Minneapolis, Scott is the Organist and Choirmaster of Saint John the Evangelist Roman Catholic Church in Stamford, CT. Before assuming this position in 1998, he was the Assistant Organist and Conductor at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC.

**Rev. Franklyn M. McAfee, D.D.** was ordained to the priesthood in Richmond on May 15, 1971. He served for four years at Saint Thomas More parish, Arlington, which became the cathedral in 1974. He was the spiritual director at Bishop O'Connell High School from 1975-78. Father McAfee was the founder of the Diocesan Office for Family Life and served as its director until 1988. He has served as secretary for the Diocesan Priests' Association and served on the Diocesan Liturgical Commission from 1985-92. He was pastor of Saint Lawrence from 1988-97 and Saint Catherine of Siena in Great Falls, VA from 1997 until he came to Saint John the Beloved in July of 2005.

**Rev. Paul F. deLadurantaye, S.T.D.** is the Diocesan Secretary for Religious Education and the Sacred Liturgy for the Diocese of Arlington. He holds a Doctorate in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical John Paul II Institute for Studies on Marriage and the Family. Father deLadurantaye is an assistant professor of theology at Christendom College and adjunct professor at Marymount University. He also serves as the Director of Studies for the Arlington Diocesan Permanent Deacon Formation Program, a judge for the Arlington Diocesan Tribunal, and a member of the Board of Trustees for the Catholic Distance University. He has served as parochial vicar at Saint Bernadette's in Springfield, Director of Liturgy at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, and parochial administrator and pastor of Queen of Apostles in Alexandria. He is currently in residence at the Cathedral of Saint Thomas More in Arlington.
